Program Overview:

Lights! Camera! Action! is aligned with the Australian Curriculum Learning Area of Drama for Year 5 and 6 students. This program introduces students to real life examples of the elements of drama, and how they can be used effectively. Students will have the opportunity to engage with and explore dramatic techniques and skills as presented by professional character performers. Throughout the program students will uncover skills and techniques for characterisation including voice, movement, mood, and creation of dramatic action, gaining an understanding on how to implement the elements of drama.
