Program Overview:

Lights! Camera! Action! is aligned with the Australian Curriculum Learning Area of Drama for Year 7 and 8 students. Throughout this program students will explore the elements of drama and actively learn techniques for improvisation, characterisation, and confidence. Students will have the opportunity to engage with professional character performers to learn the techniques and skills required to present improvisation using characterization. Using skills and techniques for characterisation including voice, movement, mood, and creation of dramatic action, students will gain an understanding on how to implement the elements of drama.
